- Sub group analysis & the "n" size issue
- Indepth & comprehensive
- Perform "Causal" type analyses
- Advantages for Theory and Policy



Analysis: What are the Determinants of Health in First Nations Communities?

- 2001 APS
- Multilevel model
- Dependent Variable: Self Rated Health
- Contextual determinants:
- -Income Inequality, Community SES
- Individual determinants
- -Income, Age, Sex, Education, Marital Status, Culture, Health Care System, Traditional Practices, Lifestyle Habits (Smoking, Drinking)
