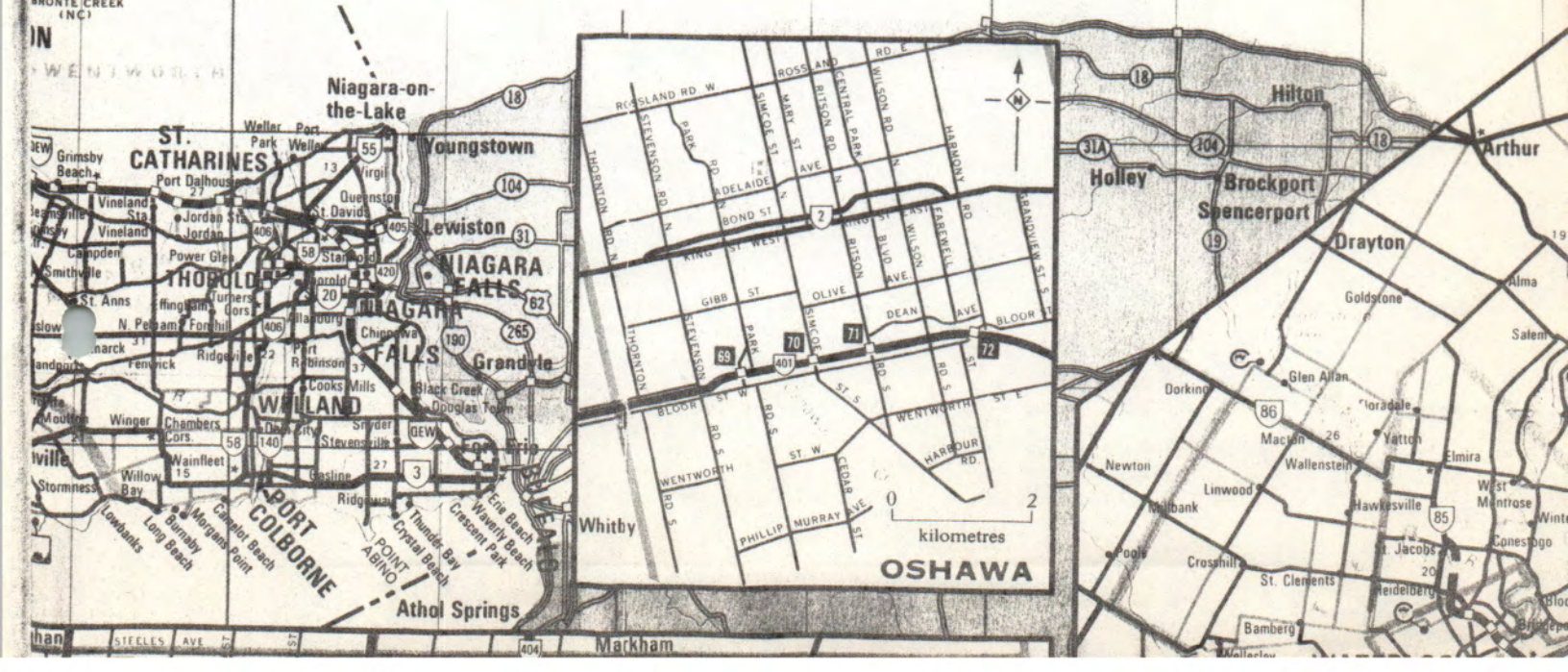

STORM DATE, MON. JULY 21ST. 1856. (FROM THE BRIGHTON FLAG.)

TORNADO.

We were visited on Monday last with a severe thunderstorm accompanied by a terrific gale of wind. In the village it did considerable damage by breaking down trees and destroying gardens by the hail. Among other disasters a new building belonging to MR. H. C. BETTERS, was blown down with a terrific crash, its timbers are literally broken to pieces. The joiners were working in the building when they saw the gale coming — they fled — and had not left it more than two or three minutes before the building was lifted from its foundations and dashed to the ground a heap of ruins. We also learn that the storm passed through the centre of the township, doing considerable damage to the crops, fences, etc.
