A WHIRLWIND.

A frightful storm passed about three fourths of a mile north of BOSTON, in the TOWNSHIP of TOWNSEND, on the afternoon of Wednesday of last week, completely levelling fences with the ground, uprooting trees, and blowing buildings over and off their foundations.

The chimneys were blown from the brick house belonging to MR. JOHN HAVILAND, smashing in the roof and causing other damage.
