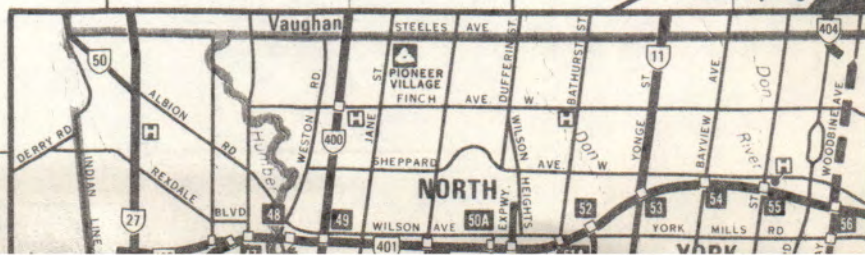

A STORM:

On the afternoon of Friday last this section of the country was visited by a whirlwind, the first of the equinoctial breezes this season, which did considerable damage, we are informed, on the track it passed over, demolishing fences, trees, etc. MR. PULFER, 1ST. LINE EAST, lost a valuable horse by a tree falling across its back; but, happily, no serious accidents to human life or limb occurred, so far as we have been able to learn.
