NEWS RECORD. FERGUS. FRIDAY JULY 22ND 1870.

STORM DATE, THURSDAY JULY 14TH.

During the storm of Thursday morning of last week a whirlwind went over the farm of MR. JAMES H. DOUGLASS in WEST DUMFRIES, striking in its course MR. DOUGLASS'S barn, partially unroofing it, and doing considerable harm. The wind afterwards threw down fences etc, passing to the south of GALT
