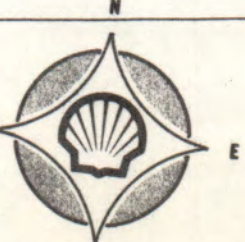

FERGUS NEWS RECORD. FRIDAY AUGUST 23RD. 1872.

STORM DATE. THURSDAY AUGUST 1ST.

On the 1st of August a terrible whirlwind passed over the 3rd CONCESSION of BLANSHARD, knocking down fences until it came to the FULLERTON TOWNLINE, then, passing through Mr. JOHN SHERIFF'S orchard, twisted a number of his fruit and ornamental trees; then knocked down his log stable, where four horses stood; carried a waggon-box about six rods and struck the stable door, breaking it in pieces and hurting some of the horses; from thence to his frame shed, stripping the roof completely of it and one-half the barn, and blew the shingles and rafters all over the farm, and blew away and killed nearly every fowl about the place, and slightly damaged his brick house; also blew away between three and four tons of hay. The loss is estimated at not less than 250 dollars.
