Megaria subsequently went to Singapore for her undergraduate studies in music at LASALLE College of the Arts, graduating with First Class Honours in Classical Music Performance under the tutelage of the Polish born pianist, Mr. Arkadiusz Bialak.

Being interested in both traditional and contemporary, solo, and chamber repertoires, Megaria has been exploring various solo and duet repertoires from Bach, Beethoven, Brahms to 20th century compositions such as John Cage, George Crumb, Oliver Knussen, Anna Pidgorna, and many others. In 2011, Megaria held a recital in Medan and in February 2016, another full concert at LASALLE College of the Arts together with fellow colleague Aloysius Foong in a collaboration of two pianos and four-hands works.

Wanting to delve deeper into music and hone her skills in performance, Megaria decided further her studies and moved to Canada for her MMus in Literature and Performance at the University of Western Ontario, under Dr. John Hess.
