THE LISTOWEL BANNER.THE ATWOOD BEE, THURSDAY APRIL 21ST. 1927.BARN DEMOLISHED BY WINDSTORM..DONALD CAMERON, TOWN LINE EAST, LOSES BARN,SHED AND WINDMILL..MUCH DAMAGE IN DISTRICT.STORM DATE. ABOUT 10 P.M., TUES. APRIL 19TH. 1927.

The first thunder and windstorm of the season struck this district on Tuesday evening about 10 o'clock and considerable damage was done in the district, although LISTOWEL escaped. The wind was very high and the rainfall heavy.

MR. DONALD CAMERON, TOWN LINE EAST, about 4 miles from LISTOWEL, was the worst sufferer in this section, as his barn, straw shed and windmill were wrecked. The scene presents a sorry spectacle. The barn and shed were blown from their foundations, and only portions of them remain standing in unexpected positions. Some of the heavy timbers broke through the floor, but none of the stock was injured.

On Wednesday neighbors were busy assisting MR. CAMERON to clean up the wreckage and building operations will begin as soon as possible. The damage was partially covered by insurance.

A report from MILVERTON tells of considerable damage to trees and buildings. The roof of the WATERWORKS BUILDING was torn off and several trees were blown down.

At PEFFERS, HENRY SAGE'S barn and J. CARSON'S house were unroofed. Trees were levelled and telephone service interrupted.

At MONKTON the barn and driving shed of PATRICK NICHOLSON were blown down. The windmill on FRED LINCE'S farm was toppled over and the driving shed turned around.
