THE ARTISTS

Patricia Green's career includes an international presence in operas, oratorios, recital and chamber music. Known for remarkable versatility and exceptional musicianship, she makes a specialty of the music of living and Canadian composers. She has created over thirty world premieres and worked with acclaimed composers such as Pierre Boulez, R. Murray Schafer, György Ligeti, Lasse Thoresen, Lori Laitman, Hilary Tann, Alice Ho, Shulamit Ran, George Walker, Emily Doolittle and Laura Schwendinger. She has 3 solo recordings on the award-winning Blue Griffin label and 9 other recordings on Albany Records, Newport Classics, and Naxos. A passionate educator, Ms. Green has taught masterclasses across China, in Italy, the U.S., and Canada. She teaches at the summer opera program, La Musica Lirica, in Novafeltria, Italy. In 2019, created the first International Institute for Voice and Piano in Xuzhou, China.

Angela Park has established herself as one of Canada's most sought-after pianists, performing across Canada, the United States, Europe, Japan, and Mexico. She is a founding member of the award-winning Ensemble Made in Canada, Mercer-Park Duo, and the AYR Trio. Angela is also an artist for Piano Six - New Generation, an organization that brings world-class pianists to remote communities across Canada. In 2010 Angela earned her DMA in Performance from the Université de Montréal, and previously received her MMus and BMus degrees from the University of Toronto. From 2011-2014, Angela was Visiting Assistant Professor of Collaborative Piano-Woodwinds at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. She has been Artist-in-Residence at Western University with Ensemble Made in Canada since 2014.

Sharon Wei is a dynamic and multi-faceted Canadian violinist, establishing herself as one of the most respected violists on the scene today. She has performed recital tours under the auspices of Debut Atlantic and Prairie Debut and won the viola prize at Yale University. Sharon co-founded Ensemble Made in Canada in 2006. They have released 3 critically acclaimed CDs and their recent Mosaïque Project toured to every province and territory in Canada. This season Sharon will perform on a Musicians from Marlboro National Tour with concerts at Carnegie Hall, Philadelphia Chamber Music Society among others. Sharon was on faculty at Yale and Stanford University and is currently Associate Professor of viola at Western University. At Western, Sharon has created a course for performance majors in which students learn off-stage initiatives such as networking, grant writing, website design, and managing finances.
