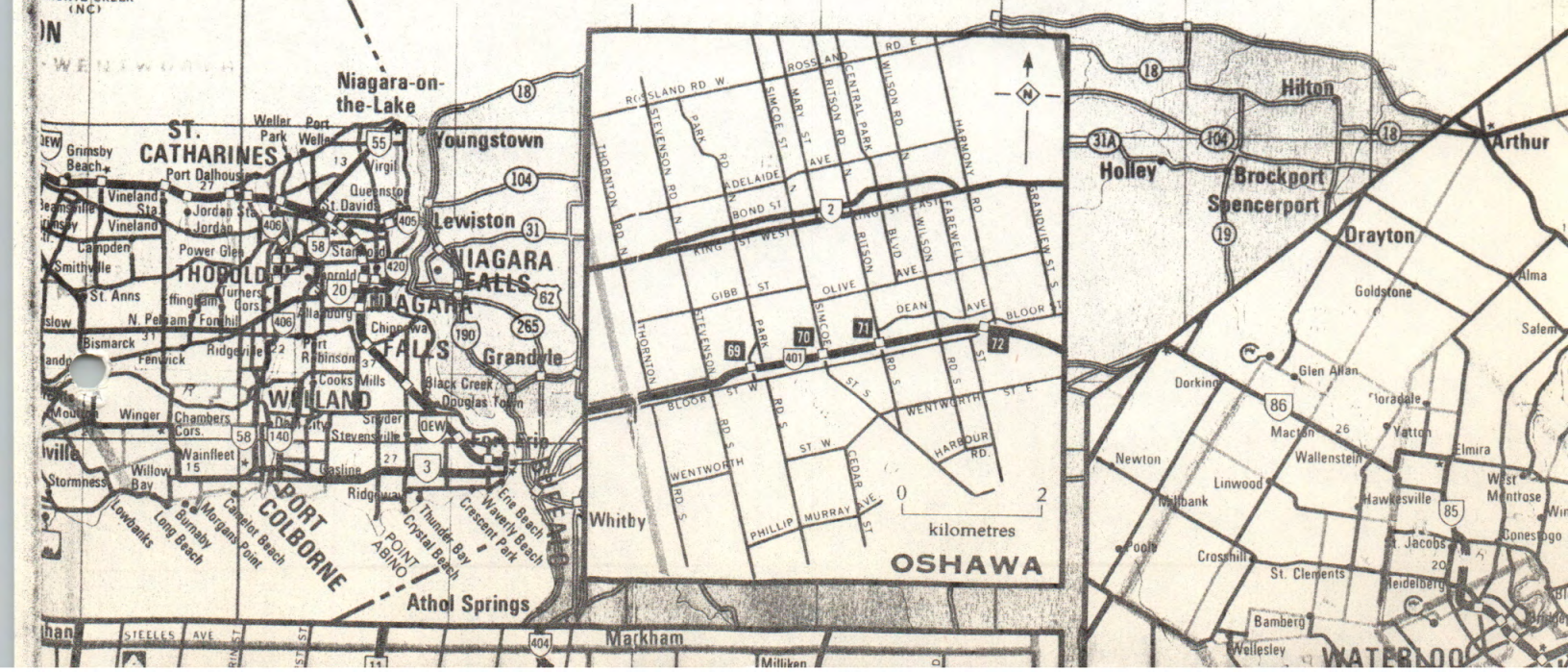

Lindsay, May 27 (CP).—A picnic party of Lindsay canoers nearly ended in tragedy on the Scugog River, Sunday, when a whirlwind twister struck one of the canoes and lifted the paddlers six feet in the air, before dropping them into the river. The incident occurred in full view of a number of people standing along the bank.

Madeline Gassler, a strong swimmer, reached shore safely, but her companion, Frederick Green, unable to swim, sank from view, but was rescued when Carl Montomeglio, a spectator, swam to his aid.

A curious feature of the accident was the fact that the canoe remained upright, and a jacket belonging to Miss Gassler, lying in the bottom of the canoe, was not even wet.
