Awarded to any undergraduate or graduate student in the Don Wright Faculty of Music on the basis of performance excellence and demonstrated in solo concerto competition, the annual [Maritsa Brookes Concerto Competition](#) has been a highlight for many students over the years. This award was made possible through the generous donation from Maritsa Ateena Brookes (BA' 57). The winner receives the honour of performing their selection in a public concert with the Western University Symphony Orchestra in the following school year. A generous monetary award is shared amongst the winners and runner-up, received in the fall following the competition.

The [Fred Pattison Piano competition](#) was established by Dr. Fred Pattison. Dr. Fred Pattison was Western's former Head of Chemistry from 1959 to 1965 and served as the Director of Student Health Services from 1973 to 1988. He had a great passion for the piano and spent many hours enjoying performances at the Don Wright Faculty of Music. This award reflects his love of music and his desire to reward excellence in piano performance.

Dr. Pattison died in 2010 at the age of 87.

In addition to a monetary award, the winner receives the honour of performing in a public recital the following year. We are pleased to share 2020 winner Terrence Wu's performance publicly today (pre-recorded last month).
