This recital is presented in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Doctor of Musical Arts in Performance degree.

Heidi Wall performs piano solo repertoire, chamber music, and concertos both locally and abroad. While studying with Anya Alexeyev at Wilfrid Laurier University for her Bachelor of Music in piano performance, Heidi placed first in the concerto competition, was awarded the gold medal for music and won two gold medals in the Canadian Music Competition. She then completed three residencies at the Banff Centre, one of which resulted in a recording of Schöenberg's Pierrot Lunaire with the Gruppo Montebello which was released on the Etcetera label in Europe. Wall completed a Masters in Music in Performance and Literature at Western University under Stephan Sylvestre in 2017. During that time, she placed first in the Maritsa Brookes Concerto Competition and was honoured with the prestigious Artistic Performance OGS Award. She is currently a DMA student at Western University. Heidi coordinates the Kitchener-Waterloo Kiwanis Music Festival and teaches privately. Heidi Wall resides in Kitchener-Waterloo, Ontario.

Canadian violinist **Marcus Willem Scholtes** recently graduated with a Doctor of Music degree in Violin Performance at Indiana University where he studied with renowned pedagogue Mimi Zweig. During his years there, he was an Associate Instructor of Violin and completed academic minors in Music Education and Conducting. Studying with Yehonatan Berick, he holds a Master of Music degree in Violin Performance from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, and an Honours Bachelor of Music degree from McGill University, Montreal, where he studied with Richard Roberts. Dr. Scholtes currently teaches at the Wilfrid Laurier University String Academy and has also been professor of String Pedagogy.

Miriam Stewart-Kroeker is an emerging cellist based in Kitchener-Waterloo, and recent graduate of McGill University with a Master's degree in cello performance under the direction of Matt Haimovitz. Highlights of this season include performances with the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, Eviole Ensemble and her piano trio with violinist Marcus Scholtes and pianist Heidi Wall.
