## Biopolitics, Necropolitics and Migration in the Novelistic Production of Donato Ndongo-Bidyogo

My thesis project focuses on the literature of Equatorial Guinea, specifically, I work with three novels of the most prolific Guinean writer Donato Ndongo-Bidyogo. I am particularly interested in the literature of migration and how the State takes part in the mobilization of people. In other words, I look at how the State through its politics, either oriented towards biopolitics or necropolitics, propels the migration of its citizens and how these politics are represented in the narrative of Ndongo-Bidyogo. My main argument is that the literature of Ndongo-Bidyogo can be taken into consideration when looking at the migration trends from Africa to Europe, particularly, from Equatorial Guinea to Spain during the colonization and post-colonization periods.
