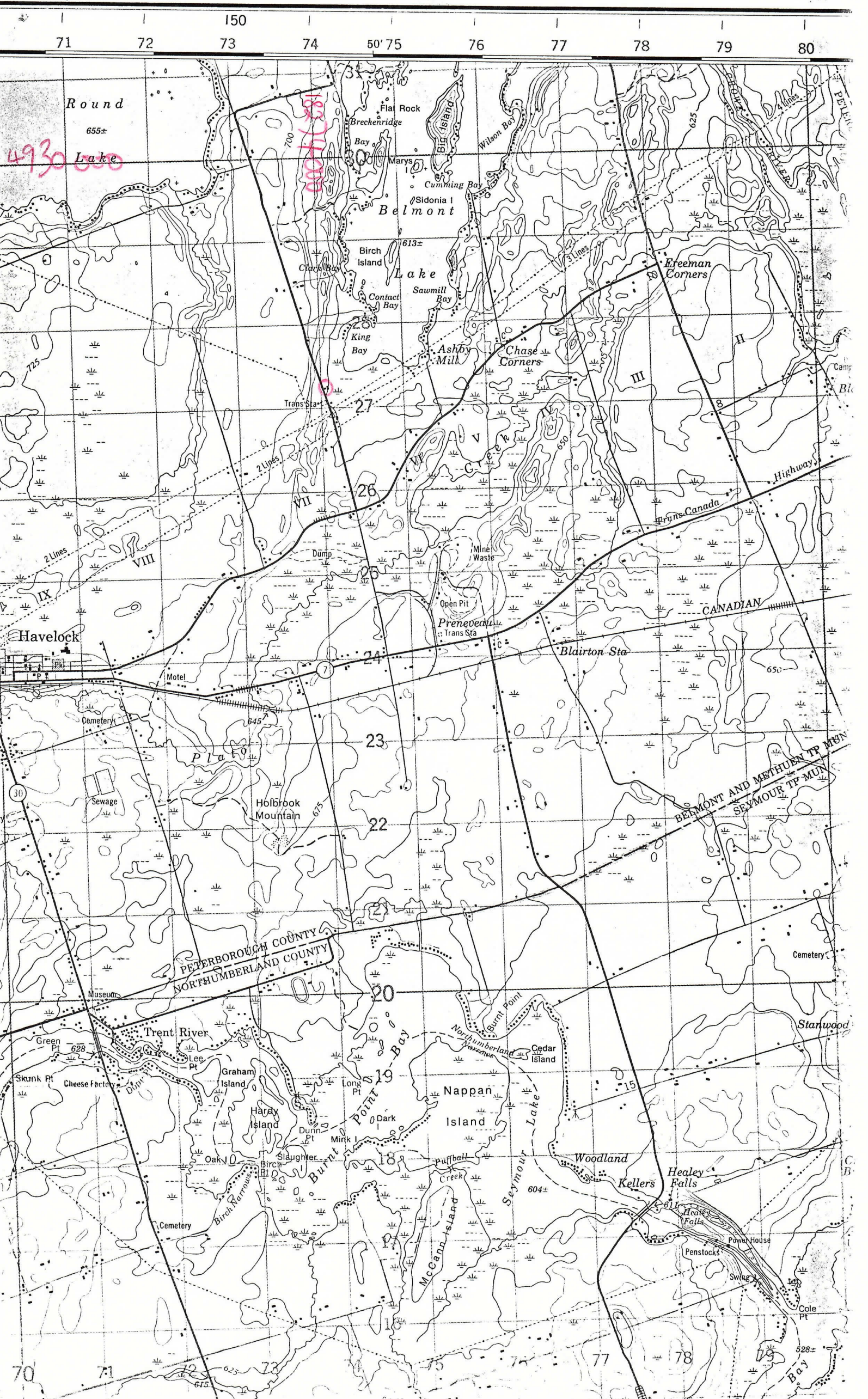

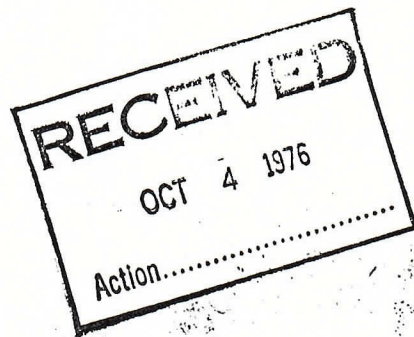

painted and I would classify it as only partly
finished. I was going to re-situate the garage
nearer the main building and put 90 lb wall
roosting in it. I don't think the kegs were
damaged which were also to be used for the new
cottage. Besides the damage I also had a
canoe which has the gunnel and slats
damaged. The canoe is cedar 5 ft, about
8 years old and was manufactured by Lakeview.
The canoe was in poor condition. The canoe
was in use for about 4-5 years and I paid
around \$200.00 at that time. The cottage is
a 'x 36' made of frame. The cottage has
no basement and 6 pyles would cost \$1000
to \$2300 and my 20 pms square foot. These
