1(b) Damaged occurred during a lull in the rain. Preceding the damage the lake (Suncoo) was observed to become very calm, then its level began pumping up and down by about 2 feet. Damage mainly to trees which were broken or uprooted. The direction of tree-fall was perpendicular to the left of the storm track. Minor property damage to small boat shelter on a cottage dock. At Lake Sincer Marie, a quonset (steel) shed about 80' x 20' x 10' was rolled over and a boat and trailer slightly damaged. The wall of a cottage boat house bulged outwards. During the storm which lasted only a few minutes, a 22' cruiser with 185 hp motor was forced to turn in a circle.
