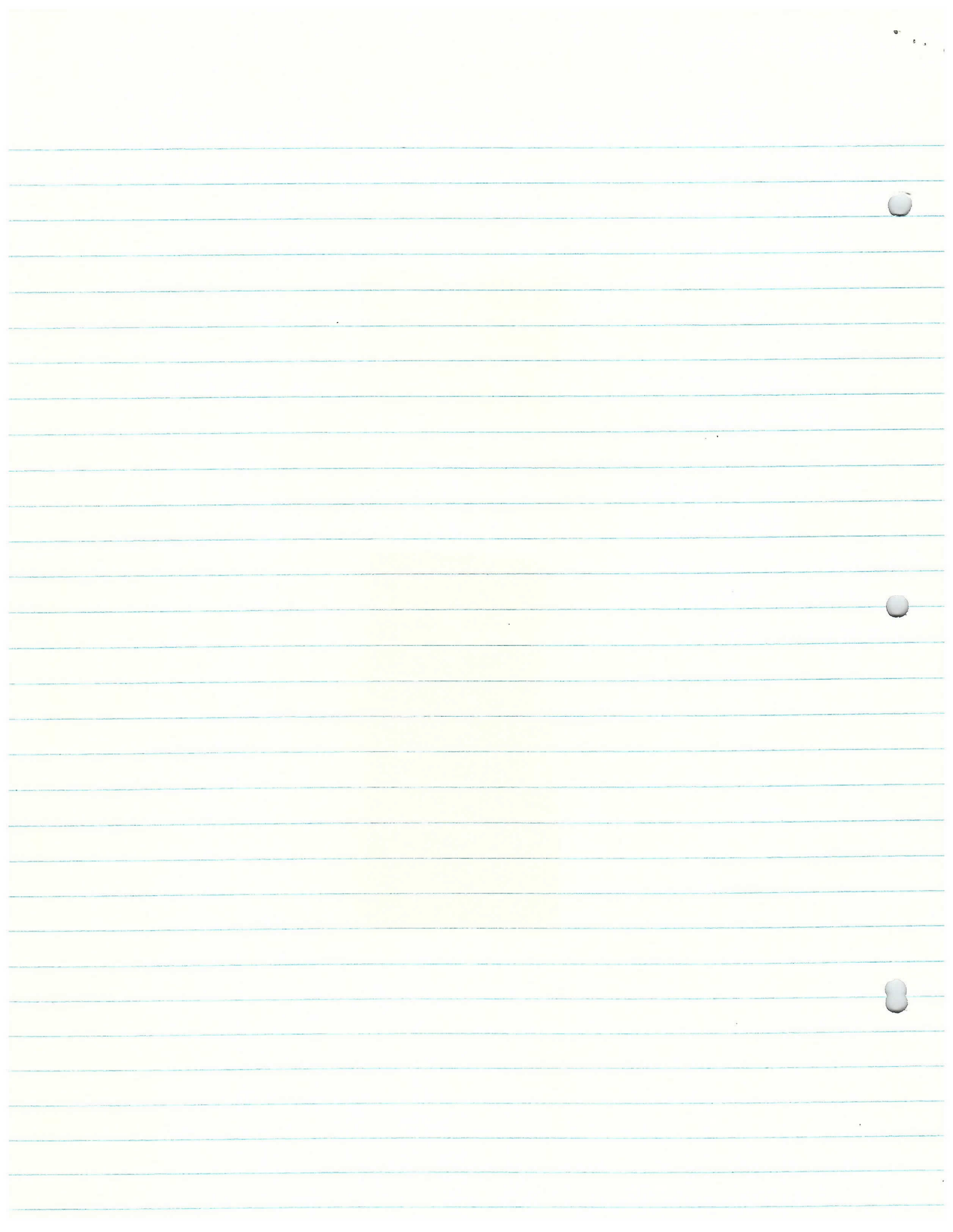

- ① Interview with Mrs Robert Wilson, Vankleek Hill, Ont.

Robert Wilson had two farm properties badly damaged at about 1730-1800 EDT. One was located on the Ridge road in Conc 3 of Caledonia Tp and the other where Ridge Road joins the boundary road between Caledonia Tp and West Hantsbury Tp. Pictures of this damage are contained in the Vankleek Hill Review. Neighbours, G Pilon and G MacL along the Ridge Road in Conc 2 also suffered severe damage.

Mrs Lewac was able to sketch in the areas of the Township which suffered property damage. From her information, the tornado in this township appeared to skip along a path about 14 km in length, oriented from SW to NE (see attached map) from just south of St-Bernardin to the vicinity of McAlpine.

Mr Bicaire confirmed that no property damage occurred in his township although there was heavy crop damage due to hail near windows. He mentioned barn damage in Clarence Tp where the road from Curran to Bourget meets the County line.
