Knowledge mobilization strategies for intimate partner violence research in Canada

The importance of mobilizing knowledge to ensure that research findings are applied to address critical health and social issues, like intimate partner violence (IPV), has gained increasing recognition. While Canadian researchers have made significant contributions to IPV research, there is limited understanding of how they share their findings beyond academic circles. My study looks at what knowledge Canadian IPV researchers share, and how they share it with professionals, policymakers, and the public. By examining selected Canadian IPV researchers' publicly available KMb products beyond traditional academic outputs such as journal articles and conference presentations, this study aims to enhance our understanding of how IPV knowledge is shared in Canada. The goal is to inform the development of improved strategies to promote evidence-based practices and policies, aimed at preventing and addressing IPV across the country.
