A terrific tornado swept over the northern part of the TOWNSHIP OF MINTO unroofing barns and scattering fences and straw stacks over the country. Mr. WILLIAM FAWCETT and a number of men were engaged in getting out ties, but the trees began to fall so thickly around them that they all rushed to the open ground and escaped without injury.
