STORM DATE. SATURDAY JULY 13TH. 1889.

WIND STORM AT MAYFIELD.

About 2 O'clock on Saturday afternoon, 13th. July a wind sprang up at MAYFIELD sweeping fences, grain, and everything that came into its path. The wind struck a barn 60x80 feet, blowing it completely over. The farmer and his son, together with a span of horses, were on the barn floor at the time and the rafters and beams fell around them in every direction.
