Damage Cost : One and a half storey solid brick house ~70% destroyed, a few others damaged to varying degrees, barns and sheds demolished, crops and orchards damaged or destroyed, hundreds of trees downed, swaths of bush levelled, large debris hurled, missiles generated.

"**Mr. Thos. Squires**, whose farm is on the west side of the village."

Roof of building carried across to "**Mr. Horace German's** home" (chimneys knocked down, damage to home, roof partially ripped off barn)

Ontario House roof ripped off and flung into trees across street to **Mrs. Cameron's** house.

Mr. J. E. Murray's house nearly hit. Large, well-built stable destroyed into a row of splintered lumber strewn onto the adjacent lot.
