STORM DATE. MONDAY JULY 25TH. 1892.

One of the most violent hurricanes and thunderstorms ever witnessed in OWEN SOUND passed over the town just after the lacrosse match between Collingwood and Owen Sound on Monday afternoon. Eight people were in the grandstand when the fiercest part of the storm came. The building was blown completely down, but no one was hurt.

Part of the front and roof of HATTON'S BLOCK was blown down by the storm. Trees in several parts of the town were hurled to the ground. There was a panic owing to a report that a number of people were buried under the ruins of the grandstand at the lacrosse match and the fireman were called out to what assistance they could give. Hundreds of citizens also repaired to the scene, but all those who had been pinned under the building had been released without suffering any injury.

UDNEY. A heavy storm of wind and rain passed over here Monday evening the 25th.

BEAVERTON. The storm on Monday night caused considerable damage around town and South of here. Several fine shade trees were broken down, besides barns being unroofed.
