HARD HIT BY FIERCE STORM.

NORTH DORCHESTER TOWNSHIP HAS CROPS DESTROYED AND BUILDINGS BLOWN
DOWN BY FRIDAY'S STORM.

ST. THOMAS, JULY 30. NORTH DORCHESTER TOWNSHIP was hit very hard by Friday afternoon's storm, the wind, rain and hail causing the worst havoc in the history of the section. All standing crops were driven into the ground.

DANIEL DIBB had a hundred chickens killed, and a brooder in which they were kept was blown across the field. ANGUS P. McCALLUM'S large new barn was torn off the cement wall and completely demolished, falling upon and killing several cows. FRANK KING'S barn met a like fate, and the barns of JOHN ABBOTT and CARL McMURRAY were partially wrecked. THOMAS A. SMALL'S buildings in the path of the storm were also destroyed.
