FIERCE WINDSTORM SWEEPS PROVINCE

**Trees Blown Down, Buildings
Wrecked and Barns Struck
by Lightning**

CLOUSBURST IN QUEBEC

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, Sept. 11.—A severe electrical and wind storm struck Ottawa shortly after noon today, accompanied by a very heavy rainfall, which literally turned the streets of the Federal capital into small streams.

An ominous darkness which necessitated the turning on of electric lights in houses, business places and street cars preceded the storm. Automobiles made their way through the streets with their headlights on. No damage is reported. Late this afternoon it was reported the residence of Albert Brown was struck by lightning, the peak of the roof and ridge boards being torn off, and shingles scattered everywhere. Street car service was continued in semi-darkness. Only minor damage to electrical equipment was sustained. No casualties have been reported so far. Considerable trouble with the telephone and telegraph services between here and Montreal occurred, and the local telephone service was also temporarily affected.

Cloudburst at Montreal.

Montreal, Sept. 11.—Preceded by half an hour of semi-darkness, a rain and electric storm which almost amounted to a cloudburst descended on Montreal early this afternoon. Trees were uprooted, one of them, in the heart of the city, blocking one of the main street car routes. Streets ran water, inches deep, and a solid sheet of water drove along the streets on a high wind.

Worst Storm of Season.

Cargill, Sept. 11.—The worst electrical storm of the season passed over this district this morning, causing considerable damage. A barn on the property of Miss Reid, at the south end of the town, near the cemetery, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground. Other buildings near-by were saved with much difficulty. Quite a lot of damage is reported around the district as a result of the storm.

Buildings Blown Down.

Hanover, Sept. 11.—The severest storm of lightning, hail and wind that has visited this section in several years occurred this morning. Considerable damage is reported east of here, where trees were uprooted and buildings blown down. The town, however, escaped the full force of the storm.

Sheep Killed by Lightning.

Orangeville, Sept. 11.—A severe electrical storm passed over here at 8 o'clock this morning. A bolt of lightning struck the residence of Alex. Walker, Church Street, and did considerable damage to the roof. Rain fell in torrents. William Morrow, Amaranth Township, three miles east of here, had eight large sheep killed by the storm.

Miniature Cyclone.

Perth, Sept. 11 — A miniature cyclone passed through the Drummond farming district near here this morning. Several windmills were blown down, trees were uprooted and several sheds destroyed. Windows in farm houses were blown in. As most of the crop in this section has already been garnered, little loss was experienced by the farmers.

United Church Struck.

Brockville, Sept. 11.—Lightning struck one of the towers of the United Church at Athens, knocking off a pinnacle and dislodging a number of stones, whence it followed a wire to a lamp post, which was demolished. There was no outbreak of fire.
