HAILSTORM, MADOC DISTRICT, ETC.

RAIN WIND AND LIGHTNING.

LINDSAY, JUNE 21. A terrific storm of rain and wind and lightning swept across a section of country north of LINDSAY, blowing down trees at STURGEON POINT, and damaging several cottages. It was the worst storm at the POINT, P.H. SKITCH, proprietor of the SWASTIKA HOTEL, at THURSTONIA PARK, on STURGEON LAKE, reports that a dozen trees were blown down in a miniature cyclone that swept across the lake. "The rain forced its way through windows as if they were not there at all."

At COBOCONK, a small cloudburst flooded the main street, blocked the sewers and flowed ankle deep over the sidewalks.

Around FENELON FALLS, the storm was equal in its ferocity, but little damage was done. Four sheep were killed by lightning on the farm of OTTO POLSON, a short distance north of FENELON FALLS.

The crew of the HALIBURTON-LINDSAY train had an unusual experience late this afternoon on the line between FENELON FALLS and BURNT RIVER, when the train was halted by a large elm tree which had fallen directly across the track, blocking all traffic. etc. etc.

SEVEN-MILE SWATH IS CUT BY TEMPEST IN NORTH HASTINGS.. LEAVES REMOVED FROM TREES.

BELLEVILLE, JUNE 21. Hailstones the size of small hen eggs, driven by terrific wind and rain storm, and cutting a swath of almost seven miles in width, completely destroyed grain and field crops in the MADOC district late this afternoon. Brief as it was disastrous, the storm commenced at 4:10 o'clock, and lasted but for ten minutes.

But in its ten minutes' duration the hailstorm cut down trees as if they were chaff in the vicinity of ELDORADO and BANNOCKBURN, stripped the leaves and small branches off the trees in and around MADOC, and broke all the windows facing north and west in that town. Both the PRESBYTERIAN and CATHOLIC CHURCHES suffered greatly in the storm, their large windows being shattered to pieces.

LINES CUT.

The fall wheat, just past the heading stage, was swept to the ground, while the later grain and the potatoes and roots were driven into the ground. Telephone communications to the northern part of the county and to BANCROFT, is cut off, but it is understood that there was considerable damage

to the crops in NORTH HASTINGS. No serious injury to any one has been reported as yet.

The storm which was accompanied by heavy thunder and lightning, left the trees for miles practically without leaves, which were cut off as with knives. BELLEVILLE received only the tail-end of the storm, though the rain fall was heavy. No damage was done in this immediate area.

ST. CATHERINES, JUNE 21. Thunderstorm.. temps. 92 and 93 degrees.

PETERBOROUGH, JUNE 21. Worst electric storm of season.. Barn struck by lightning and destroyed.. trees blown on power lines.
