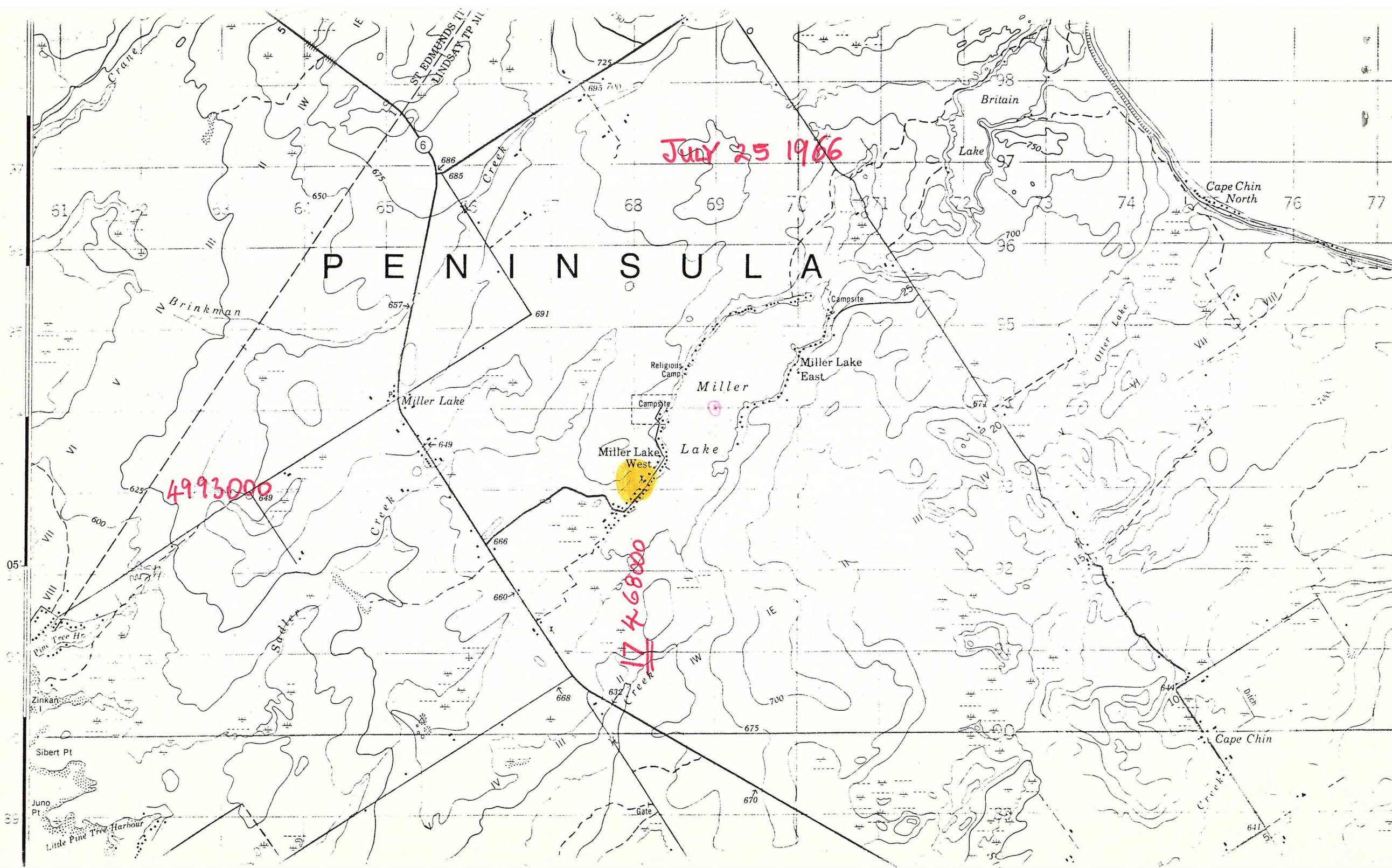

25 Huge Trees Down In Miller Lake Storm

Between 25 and 30 huge trees were uprooted in Summer House Camp on Miller Lake and fell on tents and cars during a sudden, violent storm about 9 p.m. Monday night. The trees tore down hydro lines both in the camp and along the road.

In the park, over 300 campers escaped with no injury as the big birch and maple trees crashed to the ground and the force of the wind flung heavy

picnic tables about, some as far as fifteen feet from their locations. Boats anchored at the docks were sunk for the force of the wind and the heavy rain which flooded the area.

It is not known what damage may have been done by lightning in the area, but it was estimated that winds must have reached 70 miles per hour to have toppled the huge trees.

Summer House Camp is operated by the Corbetta family.
