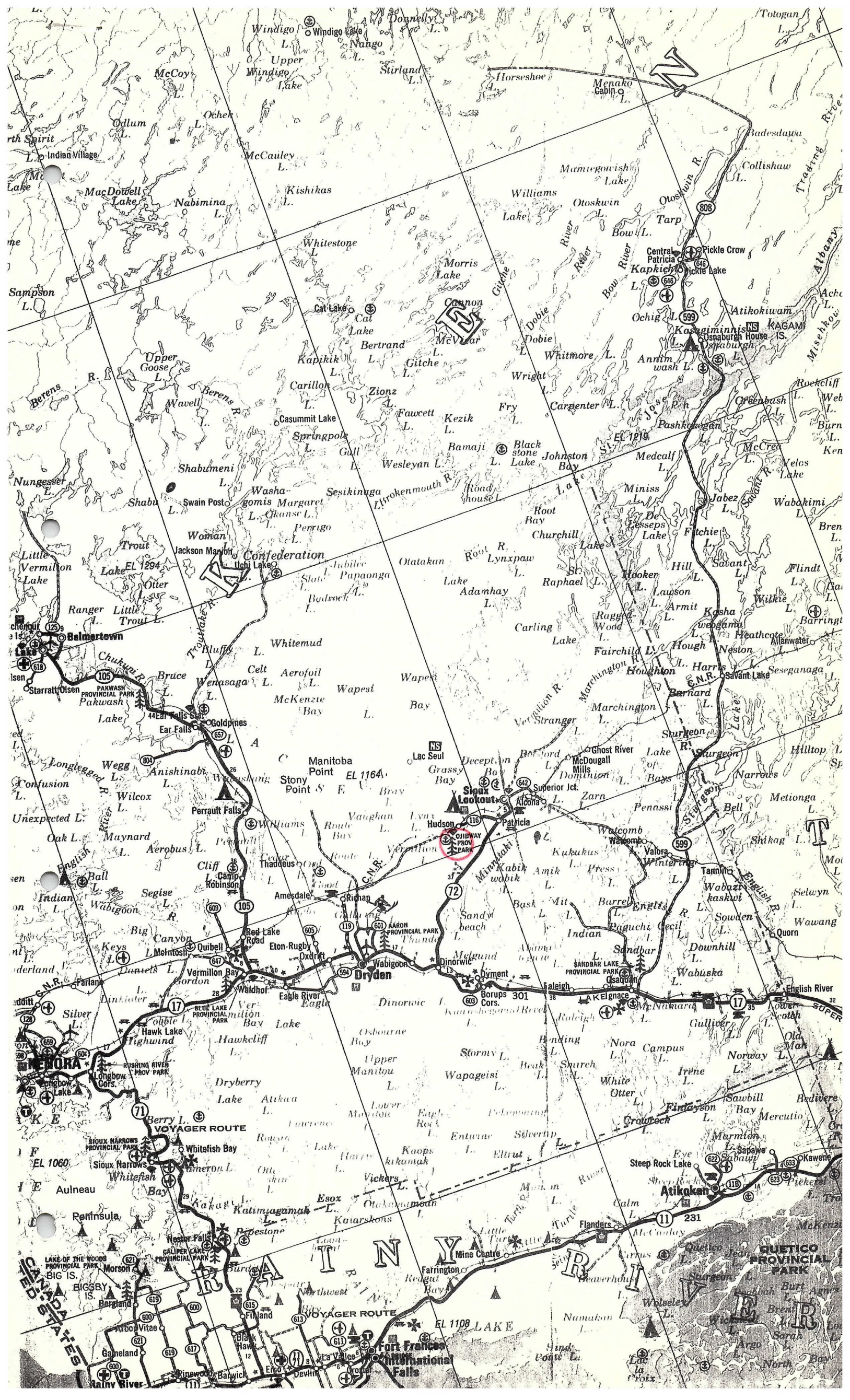

C-1055 HIGH WINDS STRIKE OJIBWAY PARK

On the evening of June 30th at approximately 6:45 p.m., winds gusting to 65 m.p.h. felled hundreds of trees in Ojibway Park located on Little Vermillion Lake.

- Severe damage was caused as trees ranging up to 20 inches in diameter were hurled to the ground. Several tents and camping trailers were damaged as a result. There were also two accidents reported which caused bodily harm, a Mrs. Edward Strong of St. Joseph, Michigan was hospitalized for two days after being struck on the head and shoulder by a falling tree. Lyn Zarecki of Sioux Lookout was also struck on the head and was fortunate in not requiring to be hospitalized.

It is expected that Maintenance crews in the Park will take 3 to 4 weeks to clean up the storm stricken trees.
