### Twister rips off car hood

A small twister touched down on a rural highway near Salem, just north of Guelph yesterday, plucking the hood from a passing car but injuring no one.

The twister lasted for a few minutes and was the second in Ontario this year, reported the weather centre.

"Twister season in Canada lasts from late March to the end of October" said forecaster, Mike Newark last night.

"We had 18 last year but they were all small. It's not a freak thing but some of them are so small they escape us undetected."

The last time a major twister struck Ontario was at Windsor in 1974 when a curling rink was demolished killing eight people.

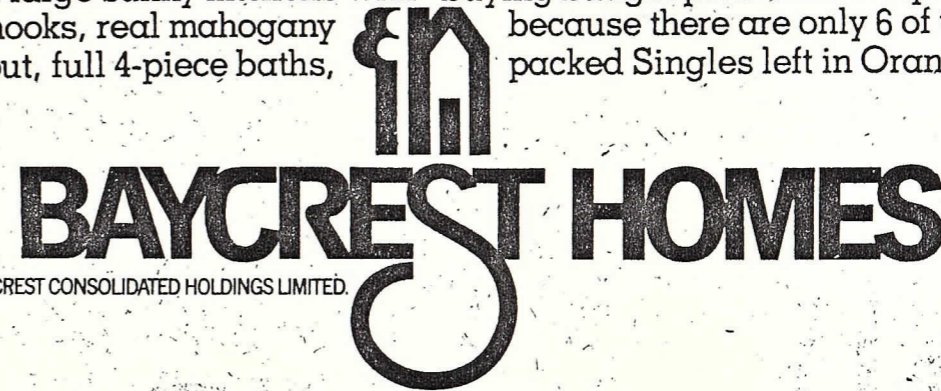
