Hello:

I would like to report a tornado that had touched down in Batchawana Ontario (50 miles north of Sault Ste. Marie).

On Tuesday Sept 11 at approx. 3:30 pm we were looking out of the window from our trailer which is located at the Silver Birch Cabins and noticed smoke billowing up from the mouth of the Carp River. My husband went to look at it and within a few minutes a funnel cloud form and started to move. It became extremely windy and he started to run towards the trailer. The awning was ready to rip off, so he grabbed the awning and I ran outside to help him, meanwhile the trailer is rocking.

The tornado came right up the driveway at Silver Birch Cabins and headed towards the bush. The owners of Silver Birch Cabins did have damage to their BBQ, Dinning Tents etc.

I am sending you a picture of the tornado as it passed. This picture is taken from Hwy 17 in front of the Silver Birch. I am also sending some pictures of the damaged it cause. This tornada passed very quickly.

I thought I might report this for your information.




Dissipating funnel

Hi Geoff:

Sorry, I do not have any other pictures of the tornado, I was helping my husband to hold down our awning as he was flying in the air like the wizard of oz (ha). Kinda funny now, but at the time it wasn't. The awning was blowing so hard that it was lifting him off the ground.

We were watching white smoke billowing upwards like smoke from a fire pit, but the smoke was pure white and this was right at the mouth of the Carp River. The smoke was not swirling at this time and the weather was a dead calm. The winds picked up and three clouds came together and formed a whirling rope touching the ground. The trees buckled over but did not break and across the highway there was no wind. (Silver Birch is located right on Highway 17 N). A Van was heading towards Pancake Bay and stopped on the highway and the funnel cloud crossed. That is when my husband turned around and started to run (he says like the bionic man) and he was running towards our trailer. As the trailer was shaking a bit, I saw him grab the awning to hold onto it and that is when I went outside to help and the winds were strong. Once the wind stopped, a few seconds later, he grabbed the camera and that is the only picture I have.

He did not notice any debris swirling around and he said that the funnel was visible to the ground.

The one picture of the boat in the garage tent did have sides to it and the owner was inside getting his fishing gear ready to go fishing. He ran out of there quick.
